

Mission and Outreach

Our "Change the world Jar" reaped \$655.81 for Cops & Kids. (Last year we raised \$650.00.) We served 88 at High Hope in August at Hamline Church, and in September we served 53 at Fourth Street Food at the Presbyterian Church. Many thanks to those who helped prepare and serve at both meals. Holiday Food Bags will be distributed November 2nd and filled bags will be collected on November 16th.

Aurora First UMC now stocks the Blessing Box (outside the side door of the church). Most of the people

who need the help of the Blessing Box are residents in Aurora, though some homeless also need things. We are collecting the following items: bottled water, granola bars, deodorant, shampoo, conditioner, soap (smaller sizes serve more folks), new socks and underwear for men and women; feminine hygiene products, paper towels, and toilet paper. We also collect the following canned items: ravioli, lasagna, spaghetti and meatballs, tuna, stews, fruits, vegetables, and spaghetti sauce. Boxed foods we'll need are mac & cheese, instant potatoes, rice, pastas, instant oatmeal, and cereal. We can also accept snack packs of pudding/jello, peanut butter, and crackers. October 12 & 19: Team 2 PLEASE DON'T BRING ANYTHING IN GLASS! The Blessing Box is supplied three times each week, and our day to help is Monday. You can place your donations in the shopping cart in the foyer.
